RESOLUTION 2010-5-A

A resolution expressing the property taxation policy of the Board of New Mount Hope Cemetery #5 District with respect to financing the 2010 annual budget for New Mount Hope Cemetery #5, Neosho County,

Whereas, K.S.A. 79-2925b provides that a resolution be adopted if property taxes levied to finance the 2010 New Mount Hope Cemetery #5 district budget exceed the amount levied to finance the 2009 New Mount Hope Cemetery #5 except with regard to revenue produced and attributable to the taxation of 1) new improvements to real property; 2) increased personal property valuation, other than increased valuation of oil and gas leaseholds and mobile homes; and 3) property which has changed in use during the past year, or with regard to revenue produced for the purpose of repaying the principal of and interest upon bonded indebtedness, temporary notes, or no-fund warrants; and

Whereas, budgeting, taxing and service level decisions for all district services are the responsibility of the district board; and

Whereas, New Mount Hope Cemetery #5 provides essential services to district residents; and

Whereas, the cost of provision of these services continues to increase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of the New Mount Hope Cemetery #5 that is our desire to notify the public of the possibility of increased property taxes to finance the 2010 New Mount Hope Cemetery #5 budget as defined above.


