

## **Post Implementation Evaluation Report**

### **Kansas Immunization Registry – Health and Environment**

Project Dates: 7/2004 through 8/2006

Project Cost: \$1,940,270

#### Project Objectives

The primary project objective of the Kansas Immunization project was to improve the health of Kansans and reduce public health care costs with the implementation of a secure Web-enabled immunization registry that is capable of gathering and maintaining accurate and current immunization data and making that data readily available to both public and private immunization providers throughout the state. Other objectives included:

- Create a new, internet accessible information system that would
  - Store immunization records containing vaccination and demographic information that are accurate, up-to-date and complete
  - Maintain records that are secure, with all information pertaining to each individual in one non-duplicative history
  - Provide Web enabled entry of immunization events
  - Provide faster more efficient reporting of immunization status
  - Provide greater security and fraud prevention abilities
  - Provide improved Workflow and record keeping
- Provide a secure web interface for both the entry and access to immunization data from private and public providers.
- Extract all legacy data into one central technology
- Expand the amount of detailed data managed by the system
